**Public Information Open House Meeting**

**STP-92-6(125) Mead – US-6/N-31; CN 13552**

The Nebraska Department of Transportation (NDOT) will hold a public information open house meeting regarding the proposed expansion of approximately 16 miles of U.S. Highway 275 (US-275) and Nebraska Highway 92 (N-92) in Saunders and Douglas counties. The meeting will be held in an open house format with no formal presentation.

Identified as **Mead – US-6/N-31**, the proposed project would expand the existing two-lane highway to a four-lane highway along three highway segments. The proposed segment of N-92 would start just east of the U.S. Highway 77 (US-77)/N-92 junction and extend east to the N-92/US-275 junction. The proposed segment of US-275 would start approximately one mile north of the US-275/Nebraska Link 28E (L-28E) junction and extend south and east to the US-275/U.S. Highway 6 (US-6) junction. The segment of L-28E would start at the L-28E/US-275 junction and extend south and west to the L-28E/N-92 junction.

The purpose of the project is to preserve the transportation asset, improve the reliability of the transportation system, and perpetuate the mobility of the traveling public. The project is needed due to insufficient roadway capacity, deteriorating pavement conditions, and inadequate bridge conditions.

The proposed project would require the acquisition of additional property rights which could include new right-of-way (ROW), control of access (CA), permanent easements (PE), temporary easements (TE), commercial and residential relocations, and/or impacts to existing center pivot irrigation systems. If your property is impacted by this project, you will be contacted by a representative once the design footprint has been established. Access to adjacent properties would be maintained during construction but may be limited at times due to traffic phasing requirements.

Potential impacts to environmental resources are being evaluated for this project. Resources being reviewed include, but are not limited to cultural resources, wetlands and water resources, hazardous materials, farmland, threatened and endangered species, parks, and more. Impacts to these resources are to be determined.

Proposed project costs are estimated at approximately \$250-\$300 million and would come from federal and state funding sources. Construction could begin as early as 2032 depending on available funding and may occur over multiple construction packages.

This public information open house meeting is being held to provide information regarding the project and to receive the public's input. All interested persons are invited to attend and present relevant comments and questions. Design information will be displayed and personnel from NDOT will be present to answer questions and receive comments. The information "open house" format allows the public to come at any time during the advertised hours, gather pertinent information about the project, speak one-on-one with project personnel, and leave as they wish. No formal presentations are planned for this meeting.

NDOT will make every reasonable accommodation to provide an accessible meeting facility for all persons. Appropriate provisions for the hearing and visually challenged or persons with Limited English Proficiency (LEP) will be made if NDOT is notified by April 28, 2026.

The public is being encouraged to make suggestions or express concerns regarding this proposed project. Comments will be collected through May 20, 2026.
